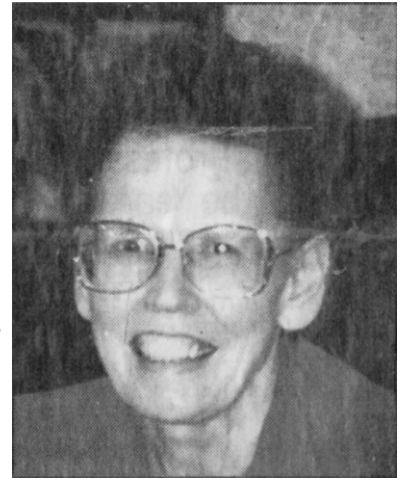


AUDREY ANN (TRUMPY) TOPP
