## Glenn E. Trumpy Stricken in Home

MONTICELLO — Glenn E. Trumpy, 24, was found dead in his bed yesterday afternoon in the Mt. Pleasant home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Jacob J. Trumpy, with whom he lived.

No decision on an inquest will be made by Deputy Coroner Theodore J. Burgy, until autopsy results are known. Mr. Trumpy reportedly had had a physical examination a month ago and had a heart condition.

Mr. Trumpy was to have taken possession of the Schuerch tavern here yesterday. When he failed to appear for the inventory, a check was made. He had been dead for some time. Mr. Trumpy attended a farewell party given by the Schuerchs the night before.

He was born Sept. 5, 1938, in Adams Township, the son of Jacob J. and Rosa Zentner Trumpy. He had farmed with his father until a month ago.

Surviving are his parents; five brothers, Norman, at home; Floyd, Albany; LeRoy, Orangeville; Ray, Brooklyn, and Richard, Footville; five sisters, Mrs. Ralph (Helen) Freitag and Mrs. Lawrence (Marion) Karlen, both of rural Monticello; Mrs. Oliver (Florence) Welton and Mrs. Delbert (Rosemarie) Krupke, both of Monroe, and Mrs. Merlin (Lorna) Boley, Mt. Horeb; and 45 nieces and nephews.

A sister, Bertha, died in 1926.
