Norman F. Trumpy, 50, Dies; Services Held on Wednesday

Funeral services for Norman F. Trumpy, 50 years of age, a native of Adams township, who died at 1:30 Saturday afternoon at Mercy hospital, Janesville, where he had been admitted that morning, were held at 1:30 Wednesday afternoon at the Zwingli United Church of Christ here.

The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, church pastor, officiated. Burial was in Highland cemetery here. Graveside services were conducted by the Amstutz-Marty American Legion post. Nephews served as pallbearers—Robert Freitag, Monticello, Rodney L. Trumpy, Steven Krupke, Stanley and Philip Welton, Monroe, Michael Trumpy, Brooklyn, Gordon Trumpy, Orangeville, and David Trumpy, Albany.

He was born Jan. 5, 1919, the son of Jacob J. and Rosa Zentner Trumpy. He attended the Dividing Ridge rural school. On March 7, 1940, he was married in Iowa to Grace Welton. He was a farmer and construction worker. He served in the U. S. Navy in World War II, enlisting in 1944 and entering active service at Great Lakes, Ill., on May 18 of that year. He saw action in the Asiatic-Pacific theatre and was with the 3rd Fleet during the Okinawa invasion.

After his discharge from the Navy on Oct. 23, 1945 as a Seaman 1/c at Great Lakes, he farmed in the Monticello-Albany area and had lived in the Janesville-Edgerton area much of the time the past few years.
