Albert Voegeli, 74, Native of Monticello Vicinity, Succumbs Rites Held Saturday P. M. For Widely Known Monroe Man

Funeral services for Albert Voegeli, 74 years of age, Monroe, a native of the Monticello community and well known throughout Green county, who passed away at about 2 Thursday afternoon at the St. Clare hospital following an illness of only a few hours, were held at 3:30 Saturday afternoon at St. John's Evangelical and Reformed church, Monroe.

The Rev. Paul C. Kehle, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Greenwood cemetery.

Mr. Voegeli was taken ill Wednesday afternoon at his farm home east of Monroe. He was removed to the hospital by ambulance.

Born at Voegeli Farm

The son of Joseph and Barbara Oberecht Voegeli, he was born on the Voegeli homestead farm, two miles northwest of Monticello, on March 30, 1873. On Oct. 25, 1894, with two sisters and a brother participating, he was married to Rosina Hefty while Fred K. Hefty was united to Regula Freitag and Nic Freitag was wed to Elsbeth Hefty. Mr. and Mrs. Voegeli had always farmed in the Monroe area. Mr. Voegeli was one of the first owners of a horse-powered threshing machine in Green county and for many years operated a large threshing ring. Timber cutting occupied much of his time in the winter months and he cleared a large amount of timber from land in the county. An industrious individual, he remained active even after he had passed the age of 70 years, and the day before he became ill, he supervised a tree trimming job in Monroe.

Surviving are the widow; one daughter, Mrs. Gordon Bevins, Wisconsin Rapids; two sons, Raymond A., at home, and Thomas H., Madison; one brother, Emil, Monticello, who is the last remaining member of the family of 14 children; three grandchildren, and four great grandchildren,
