Alfred Voegeli 1887 - September 28, 1974

Alfred Voegeli, 87, a well-known Monroe resident, died Saturday, September 28, at the Monroe Manor Nursing Home. He had been in failing health for the past three weeks and was admitted to the Manor on September 5.
