Mrs. Emil G. Voegeli, 417 E. Lake Ave., Monticello, died Saturday, June 21, in St. Clare Hospital, Monroe after a short hospitalization. She was born in Washington Township on February 5, 1894, the daughter of Jesse and Rose Wittwer Lemon. She graduated from Monticello High School in 1912, the first four year class to graduate from Monticello High School, and then attended Milwaukee Normal School for one year. Her marriage to Emil G. Voegeli took place on September 25, 1913, in Monticello, and they farmed in Washington Township until 1931, when they moved to Monticello. Mr. Voegeli is a retired Monticello businessman.
