## Dies of Injuries, Rites Held Wednesday

Funeral services for Mrs. Joe J. Voegeli, 73 years of age, esteemed resident of Monticello for more than 50 years, who passed away at 3:05 a. m. Monday at the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, were held at 2 Wednesday afternoon at the Zwingli United Church of Christ here.

The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were John H. Baebler, Robert G. Fernstaedt, Elmer Freitag, Albert Knobel, Laurance G. Marty and Walter Haddinger.

Mrs. Voegeli died as the result of injuries sustained in a fall on Friday afternoon. She never regained consciousness.

Rose Anna Schilt was born in New Glarus Dec. 31, 1889, the daughter of Gottfried and Barbara Wuetrich Schilt. She was a school teacher, and on Sept. 21, 1911, she was united in marriage to Joe J. Voegeli. They had always lived in Monticello, where they operated a hardware store until two years ago.

Mrs. Voegeli was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ and its Ladies' Aid Circle, and of the Order of the Eastern Star and Women's Relief Corps.

She is survived by her husband; one son, Donald, an associate professor in the School of Music at the University of Wisconsin; two brothers, John, Sioux Falls, S. D., and Rudy, Monroe; and four grandchildren, Thomas, Kim, Jim and Julie Voegeli.

She was preceded in death by two grandchildren, Donna Jean in 1949 and Bobby, 1953, and two brothers, Fred, in 1954, and Jacob, Mendota, Ill, in 1960.
