

Frank Walmer

Feb. 21, 1882 – April 12, 1922

Frank Walmer, well known Mt, Pleasant farmer, living four miles east of Monticello, was fatally injured at about 3:30 o'clock Thursday afternoon, when his clothes became caught in the pulley of a gasoline engine. He passed away during the night without regaining consciousness.

The fatal accident happened while Mr. Walmer was engaged in grinding feed and it is presumed that he was alone at the time, inasmuch as he had been getting along without the aid of a hired man. A physician was summoned from Albany following the accident, but upon his arrival he found the condition of the unfortunate man such as to discourage any thought of his ultimate recovery.

Mr. Walmer was about 40 years of age and is survived by his wife and one child. Mrs, Walmer is a former Monticello girl, her maiden name having been Miss Flora Wescott. Mr. Walmer was one of the industrious farmers of Mt. Pleasant township and was well liked by those who knew him because of his genial disposition and neighborly spirit. — Monticello Messenger.
