Mrs. Wendler Dies After Long Illness

Funeral services for Mrs. Clarence Wendler, 45 years of age, Monticello, who passed away at her home here at 5 a. m. Monday after a long illness, were held at 2 Wednesday afternoon in the Voegeli funeral home.

The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, pastor of Zwingli United Church of Christ, officiated, and burial was in Hillcrest cemetery, Albany. Pallbearers were John F. Black, Juda, Walter F. Hoesly, Casper Mallory, Victor L. Stauffacher. Walter Tertin, Monroe, and Paul Ziehli, Belleville.

Mrs. Wendler had been in ill health for the past year and was hospitalized many times during that period.

Born at Black Earth March 11, 1916, Vivian Elvira Dame was the daughter of Howard and Mabel Foye Dame. She attended school in Black Earth and Albany. On Dec. 18, 1937, she was united in marriage to Clarence Wendler, the ceremony taking place in Dubuque, Iowa. They farmed in the Oakley area for five years and later farmed south of Monticello. They moved to the village 16 years ago.

She is survived by her husband; one son, John A., Monticello; one daughter, Mary Ann, at home, and one granddaughter.

She was preceded in death by her parents and one sister.
