Dec. 9, 1930 - May 13, 1974

Robert L. Wilson, 43, Washington Township, Rt. 4, Monroe, was pronounced dead on arrival at St. Clare Hospital at 2:35 a.m. today, Monday, May 13.

Coroner Richard Wagner ruled death a suicide, from a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

Mr. Wilson was born in Tyrone Township, Blair County, Pa., Dec. 9, 1930, a son of Paul E. and Katharine Phillips Wilson. He was a veteran of the Korean war, serving Oct. 8, 1952, until Sept. 23, 1954, with more than a year in Korea. He was discharged as a private first class and had received the National Service Defense Medal, United Nations Service Medal, Korean Service Medal with one Bronze battle star and the Good Conduct medal.

He was married Nov. 30, 1959, in West Virginia to Temperance Solt. They farmed, moving to Wisconsin in 1960, first to the Belleville area and then five years in the Darlington area and the past five years in the Monroe area.

He was a member of the Washington Reformation Church.

Surviving are his widow, Temperance; his mother, Mrs. Katharine Mayes, Fairport, N.Y.; two daughters, Juanita and Wava, both at home; two brothers and three sisters.

His mother and stepfather and other relatives are enroute here.
