Mrs. A. H. Wright 83, Dies Saturday; Rites Held Tuesday

Funeral services for Mrs. Arthur H. Wright, 83 years of age, Monticello, who passed away Saturday afternoon at 5 o'clock in the Poynette hospital, where she had been confined for a short time, were held at 1:30 Tuesday afternoon at the Evangelical United Brethren church here.

The Rev. Paul C. Gibson, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were Fred Escher, Henry Duerst, Henry J. Elmer, Albert Knobel, Herman G. Karlen and Dr. C. J. Klooster.

Sally Ann Brayton was the daughter of Sidney and Mary Pratt Brayton. On July 3, 1897, she was united in marriage at Albany to Arthur H. Wright, who became a veteran Milwaukee railroad employee. Following their marriage they lived in Madison and Davenport, Iowa, for short periods, he being a traveling auditor with the railroad at that time. For many years they resided in Monticello, where Mr. Wright was station agent, with the exception of three years when he was station agent in New Glarus.

Mrs. Wright was a charter member of the Women's Relief Corps here and attended the Evangelical United Brethren church.

She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Mildred Youngs, Poynette, with whom she had made her home the past year, and Mrs. Byron Long, Janesville; one brother, Joseph Brayton, Monticello; three grandchildren, Ronald Youngs, Poynette, Dick Lona, Janesville, and Jerry Wright, Madison; and two great-grandchildren.

Mrs. Wright was preceded in death by her husband, Jan. 21, 1955; one son, Edgar, March 26, 1954; three sisters, Mrs. E. B. Wallom, July 22, 1955; Mrs. Chloe Thompson, Britt, Iowa, and one sister, Effie, who passed away as a young girl, and another sister Mrs. Emma Price; and one brother, Alvin, 1947.
