John (Hunse) Wyman Succumbs Tuesday

John (Hunse) Wyman, 73, a resident of Monroe for a number of years, died at 1:45 a.m. Tuesday at the home of his sister, Mrs. Frieda Bernet, Monroe, with whom he has made his home since 1957.

He had submitted to surgery about a year ago and had been in failing health since that time.

He was born at Langau, Canton Berne, Switzerland, April 22, 1893, the son of Andrew and Anna Zogg Wyman. He attended school in Switzerland and came to the United States in 1922, locating in Monticello. For many years he assisted his brother-in-law, Peter Bernet, in making cheese at the Clover Hill factory, east of Monticello. From 1942 to 1957 he was employed at the Pet Milk company, New Glarus. He returned for his first visit back to Switzerland with the New Glarus Mannerchor group in 1964.

He is survived by three sisters, Mrs. Bernet, and two sisters and one brother in Switzerland; three nieces, Mrs. Warren Prisk, Monticello, Mrs. Raymond R. Hoesly, Janesville, and Mrs. Robert Nafzger Monroe, and two nephews, Wilbert and John Bernet, Monroe He was preceded in death by three brothers in Switzerland.
