Mrs. O. H. Zentner, Aged 62, Dies; Rites Held Wednesday

Zentner, Sr., 62 years of age, resident of Monticello for the past five years, who passed away at 3:45 o'clock Sunday morning in the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, following an extended illness, were held at 2 Wednesday afternoon in the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church.

Mrs, Zentner had experienced failing health for a number of months and during the weeks preceding her death her condition was critical.

On Nov. 15, 1910, she was united in marriage to Oswald H. Zentner, the ceremony taking place in Monticello. Mr. and Mrs. Zentner farmed on the Zentner farm, near Highway 69, between Monticello and New Glarus, until they retired and moved to Monticello in March, 1947.

Mrs. Zentner was a loyal and devoted member of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church.
