Her husband, returning early from work, found Mrs. Zimmerli lying on the floor.

Anna Zimmerli was a native of Switzerland and was born Dec. 4, 1872. Her marriage to John Zimmerli occurred in 1889 in Switzerland. Four year later, in 1893, they came to America, settling in Green county. For 27 years they resided on the C. B. Smiley farm, two miles west of the village. Mr. and Mrs. Zimmerli moved to Albany 16 years ago.

Surviving are the widower, three sons, John, Jr., and William, Albany, and Pvt. Albert Zimmerli, Camp. Swift, Texas; four daughters, Mrs. Gene Jones and Mrs. Alvin Peterson, Albany, Mrs. Charles Webb, Monroe, and Mrs. Frank Wilson, Long Beach, Calif.; and one sister, Mrs.. Casper Hammerli, Monroe. Her parents and an infant son preceded her in death.
