Funeral Tuesday for Mrs. Emma Zimmerli, Monticello Resident

Monticello—(Special)—Funeral services for Mrs. Emma Zimmerli, 52, who died at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Mueller, Verona, Saturday morning, will be held at 2 Tuesday afternoon in the Zwingli-Evangelical and Reformed church, Monticello. Rev. Walter J. Stuckey, pastor of the Swiss Evangelical and Reformed church, New Glarus, will officiate in the absence of Rev. A. R. Achtemeier and burial will be in the Highland cemetery. The body will be at the Voegeli funeral home until noon Tuesday when it will be taken to the church to lie in state until time of the funeral.

Born in Canton Bern, Switzerland, Oct. 20, 1892, Emma Varena Ammon, the daughter of Rudolph and Varena Hildbolt Ammon, came to America in 1913 and settled in Monticello. She married Gottlieb Zimmerli in Monroe, April 30, 1914. They lived in Monticello for a few years after

their marriage and then resided on a farm in Washington township until 1934 when Mr. Zimmerli died. Since his death, Mrs. Zimmerli had made her home with Mr. and Mrs. Mueller.

Mrs. Zimmerli was a charter member of the Madison Swiss club and a member of the Ladies Aid of the Washington Township Reformed church.

Survivors are five brothers, Rudy, Adams township, Adolph, Milwaukee, John, Winslow, Ernest, Monroe, Fred, government worker in Alaska; and two sisters, Mrs. Walter Henning, New Glarus, and Anna, Switzerland.
