Rites Held Friday P. M. for Former Monticello Citizen Mrs. Rudy Zimmerman, 87, Dies Wednesday In Evansville

Funeral services for Mrs. Rudy Zimmerman, 87 years of age, resident of Monticello for more than 30 years, who passed away on Wednesday morning of last week at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Charles Petersen, Evansville, following seven months of failing health, were held at 2 Friday afternoon in the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church here.

The Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. The body was brought to Monticello early Wednesday and remained at the Voegeli funeral home until the day of the services.

Mrs. Zimmerman had lived in Monticello until two or three years ago, when she went to Evansville to reside with her daughter. Death was attributed to infirmities of old age,

Verena Zimmerman was born in New Glarus township March 6, 1857, the daughter of Frederick and Verena Rhyner Zimmerman, numbered among the pioneer settlers of northern Green county. On Jan, 16, 1878, she was united in marriage to Rudy Zimmerman, the ceremony taking place in Monroe. The couple followed the vocation of farming and owned and operated a farm in Attica for many years before moving to Monticello to make their home in 1912.

Mrs. Zimmerman, a highly esteemed and well liked citizen of the village for so many years, was a member of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church and was also active in the church Ladies' Aid society for many years.

Respected by all whom she numbered among her acquaintances, Mrs. Zimmerman's passing occasioned sincere regret among her many friends here,

Surviving are the daughter, two sons, Lee Zimmerman, Hinsdale, Ill, and ErvIn Zimmerman, residing on the homestead farm in Attica; five grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren; and a brother, Fred Zimmerman, Junction City. She was preceded in death by one son, one sister, a brother, both parents, and her husband, who died in 1934 in Monticello.
