Daniel W. Zurfluh, 27, of Portland Oregon, formerly of the Albany area, died Saturday, May 21, 1994, at the University of Massachusetts Medical Center, Worcester, Massachusetts, after a work-related accident suffered on Wednesday, May 18.

Daniel was born on October 24, 1966, in Monroe to William and Kathleen (Flood) Zurfluh, of Brooklyn Township. He was married to the former Carmen A. Gavilan on July 9, 1993 in Lima, Peru. A graduate of Albany High School, Daniel attended the Wisconsin School of Electronics. He then went to work for Lignomat Company in Portland, Oregon, as an electronic technician, installing controls for lumber drying kilns. He was a former member of the Jolly Mixers 4-H Club and former member and past president of the Future Farmers of America. While in high school, he was a member of the wrestling team.

He is survived by his wife, Carmen, and a step-son, Miguel A. Montoya, both of Portland, Oregon; his parents, William and Kathleen Zurfluh of Brooklyn Township; a brother, Thomas J, Zurfluh of Harvard, Illinois; his maternal grandmother, Helen Flood of Brooklyn; and his paternal grandmother, Wilma Zurfluh of Albany.
