

**Emma Helene Babler**  
**June 30, 1907 - Nov. 12, 1967**  
**Mrs. Babler Stricken at 60**

Mrs. Herman Babler, 60, died in her sleep shortly after Saturday midnight, Nov. 12, 1967.

Coroner Richard A. Wagner investigated and determined that she died of natural causes. No inquest will be held.

The former Emma Helene Wyss was born June 30, 1907 in Calamine, a daughter of Henry and Minnie Sellnow Wyss. She moved to Monroe, with her parents, when she was four years old. On Dec. 1, 1927 she was married in Monroe to Herman Babler and had since lived in the same house in Monticello, 323 Urban Road.

Mrs. Babler was a member of Zwingli United Church of Christ and its Aid Circle and of the John Ross Woman's Relief Corps.

Surviving are her husband; two sons, Donald H. Janesville, and Allan, Madison; two daughters, Mrs. Darrell (Beverly) Hilliard, Route 4, Monroe, and Miss Jean Babler, Madison; three sisters, Mrs. Henry (Alma) Elmer and Mrs. Fred (Elsie) Hirschbrunner, both of Darlington, and Mrs. James E. (Leonia) Farmer, Monroe, and seven. grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents; five sisters, Minnie and Lena Wyss, Mrs. Uyanna White, Mrs. Christ Yaussi, and Mrs. Ida Richardson, and two brothers, Henry Jr. and Walter Wyss.

Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 15, in Zwingli Church. Rev. J. Allan Mittler is to officiate. Burial will be in Highland Cemetery.
