MRS. H. E. BABLER, OF MT. PLEASANT, DIES
END COMES AFTER ILLNESS OF SEVERAL YEARS; RITES SUNDAY

Monticello. – (Special) – Mrs. Henry E. Babler, aged 44, died at 3:30 Thursday afternoon in her Mt. Pleasant township home, after an illness of several years. She spent some time last autumn in a Madison hospital. A complication of diseases was fatal.

Rose Zimmerman, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Zimmerman, was born in New Glarus Nov. 1, 1888. As a child she came with her parents to a farm near Monticello. She was confirmed by Rev. Carl Heyl, March 27, 1904. In 1906 she was graduated from Monticello high school. Her marriage to Henry E. Babler took place Feb. 5, 1907 and they had since resided in Mt. Pleasant township.

Always a member of the German Reformed church, Mrs. Babler had been active in its aid society. She was known as a person of cheerful disposition, devoted to her home and her family.

Surviving are the widower, three children, Bernice, Willis and Harris, at home; her parents, in Monticello; four sisters, Mrs. Henry C. Elmer and Mrs. Leon Voegeli, Monticello; Mrs. Fred Hadinger, Fort Atkinson; Mrs. C. A. Eckberg, Plymouth, and one granddaughter. A brother and sister are deceased.

Funeral services will be conducted at 1 Sunday afternoon in the home and at 1:30 in the Reformed church, by Rev. A. Muehlmeier. Burial will be in Highland cemetery.
