On March 5, 1889, she, was united in marriage to Conrad Baebler. The following year they moved to the vicinity of Lu Verne, Iowa, where they engaged in farming for 10 years, returning to Mt, Pleasant township in 1901. Mr. Baebler preceded her in dear on Dec. 12, 1916.

Survivors are two sons, Henry. V. and John, at home; one daughter, Mrs, Adam Pancake, Whitewater; and two grandchildren.
