Rites Held Here for Mrs. J. W. Barlow

Funeral service for Mrs. J. Wendell (Dorothy) Barlow, age 75, Milwaukee, former Monticello resident, who died on Tuesday of last week after suffering a stroke at her home there, were held at 2 Saturday afternoon in the Zwingli United Church of Christ here, of which she was a member.

Dr. Howard L. Orians, Madison, retired area Evangelical United Brethren church minister, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery here. Pallbearers were Thomas Brusveen, Fred T. Burgy, L. G. Marty, Howard R. Steinmann, Dr. R. A. Woodruff and John Streiff. Honorary pallbearers were J. Herbert Burgy, Monroe, Fred Escher, C. W. Karlen and R. W. Woelffer.

Dorothy Ann Pollys was born at Melrose, Oct. 8, 1895, a daughter of Abner and Minnie James Pollys. She attended La Crosse Normal. In 1917 she came to Monticello and taught in the grade school here and had always lived here until moving to Milwaukee. On June 15, 1918, she was united in marriage in Freeport to J. Wendell Barlow. Mr. Barlow, who was cashier of the Bank of Monticello for 26 years, died May 31, 1953, at North Bend, while there for the funeral of his wife's mother.

After the death of her husband, Mrs. Barlow took up teaching in the grade school at Blanchardville and later served as children's librarian in Monroe, moving to Milwaukee upon retiring from her duties in Monroe. In 1948, Mrs. Barlow took an active part in establishing the Monticello village library.

In addition to membership in Zwingli church, she was a charter member of Amstutz-Marty American Legion Auxiliary, a member and past worthy matron of the Monticello Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star, member and past president of John Ross Relief Corps, and a member of the National Genealogy Society and of the D. A. R.

She is survived by a son, Wallace, and a daughter, Mrs. Edward Mills, both of Milwaukee, a sister, Mrs. Mae Milbricht, Melrose, and five grandchildren.
