Mrs. Bindschaedler, 84, Monroe, Dies: Rites Held Friday

Funeral services for Mrs. Regula Bindschaedler, 84 years of age, Monroe, a former resident of the Monticello area, who passed away in the St. Clare hospital on Wednesday afternoon of last week, were held at 2 Friday afternoon in the Stuessy funeral home, Monroe.

The Rev. Paul C. Kehle, pastor of St. John's Evangelical and Reformed church, Monroe, officiated, and burial was in Greenwood cemetery.

Mrs. Bindschaedler had been in failing health for several months and on Dec. 29 she underwent surgery.

Native of Switzerland

The daughter of Oswald and Suzanne Babler Zentner, she was born Oct. 17, 1870, in Elm, Canton Glarus, Switzerland. She received her education in Switzerland. In March, 1882, she came to America with her mother, settling in the Monticello and New Glarus area. On Jan. 28, 1892, she was united in marriage to Charles H. Bindschaedler, the ceremony taking place in Monticello. They lived in Milwaukee for five years, where he worked as a baker. Later they moved to Monroe, where Mrs. Bindschaedler had resided for the past 51 years.

Mrs. Bindschaedler was confirmed in the Swiss Evangelical and Reformed church, New Glarus.

Surviving are three daughters, Mrs. R. W. Woelffer, Monticello, Mrs. William Greub and Miss Hannah Bindschaedler, both of Monroe; one brother, Henry Zentner, St. Croix Falls; two sisters, Mrs. Fred C. Elmer, Sr., Monticello, and Mrs. Herman Butts, Matawan, Minn.; and two grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband, who died in November, 1927, and six brothers and three sisters.
