

Miss Dolores Blum, 51, Dies; Rites Held Friday Afternoon
May 9, 1904 – July 13, 1955

Funeral services for Miss Dolores Blum, 51 years of age, who passed away at 4 Wednesday afternoon at the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, following a short illness, were held at 2 Friday afternoon at the Voegeli funeral home.

The Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, pastor of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were Edwin Wirth, Walter Kubly, Louis Wyss, John Streiff, Karl Duerst and Eugene Webber.

Miss Blum was the victim of a cerebral hemorrhage, with which she was seized the Sunday night before her death. She was hospitalized immediately, but she never rallied sufficiently and her condition was critical until the end

Born in New Glarus, May 9, 1904, the daughter of Emil and Margaret Marty Blum, she came to Monticello with her parents when she was a small child. She attended the Monticello high school and spent all of her adult life in Monticello. For the past nine years she had been employed at Streiff's Grocery store.

She, was a confirmed member of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church.

A friendly, jolly individual, Miss Blum always greeted visitors to her place of employment in a cheery manner. She will be deeply missed by her many friends and acquaintances in the Monticello community.

She is survived by her mother; two brothers. Lawrence, New Glarus. and Ray E.. Monticello, and one sister. Margaret, at home.
