Grandma Booher Dies at Kilbourn, Sunday. Funeral Held Here.

October 10, 1823 – July 1907

Lucinda Booher, widow of William Hugh Booher, deceased, was born October 10, 1823, in the state of Ohio. Upon reaching the proper age, she was married to William Hugh Booher and their union was blessed with six children, five sons and one daughter, namely, John, Joseph, Andrew, Robert, David and Lucinda, now Mrs. Lucinda Walters. The oldest son, John, preceded his mother in death a number of years ago. Mr. Booher, who was one of the veterans of the civil war, died about thirty years ago. He and his wife were pioneers of this county, driving here from Ohio in 1859. With the exception of a few years Mrs. Booher spent all her life in this vicinity. She was well know here especially to the older residents, a good and kind neighbor, a faithful mother of good christian character and a great friend of the young boys and girls of the town, among whom she was known as "Grandma Booher."

She had been ailing of old age for a number of years. Especially her eyes became very weak. About two weeks ago one of her sons, Mr. Joseph Booher, of Kilbourn, Wis., took her to his home, but she was not destined to be with him very long. She died Sunday morning at 2 o'clock, attaining the age of 84 years less three months.

The funeral service was held Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock from her late residence and 2:30 at the German Reformed church, the Rev. Carl Heyl officiating. It had been the intention to hold the funeral Wednesday forenoon but circumstances made a change of time necessary. Nevertheless a number of friends and neighbors learned pf the change in time and escorted her to her last resting place. May she rest in peace.
