Edwin Chesebro, 70, Life-Long County Resident, Succumbs
Burial Rites to Take Place In Monroe Cemetery Thursday

Edwin Chesebro, native of this vicinity and a life-long resident of Green county, passed away at 11:15 Sunday morning at his home in Monroe, where he had resided for the past several years. He was 70 years of age. Mr. Chesebro had been in failing health for over two years and of late his condition became critical.

Born in Mt. Pleasant township July 29, 1865, the deceased was a son of Elldridge and Elmira Ketchum Chesebro. For many years he was successfully engaged in farming in Washington township, a few mites south of Monticello, on the Monroe-Monticello road, moving to Monroe in 1920. The homestead farm is now conducted by his son, Kay Chesebro.

Married in Monroe

Mr. Chesebro was married in Monroe Nov. 13, 1890, to Lurania Snyder, the widow who survives him. Besides the widow, he is survived by the one son, Kay, and three grandsons, Montgomery and Mereland Chesebro, Washington township, and Ralph Niffenegger, who had made his home with his grandparents in Monroe. He also leaves two brothers, Allen Chesebro, Monroe, and Eldridge Chesebro, Washington township. He was preceded in death by two sons, who died in infancy, and a daughter, Mrs. Zetta Niffenegger.

Funeral services will be conducted at 1:30 this (Thursday) afternoon in the Chesebro home, 1017 Eleventh avenue, and at 2 in the Union church, with the pastor, Rev. E. E. Remaly, officiating. Burial will be in Greenwood cemetery.
