Cotherman Boy Dies; Rites This Morning

Last rites for Carlyle Cotherman, aged 4, little son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Cotherman, residing five miles south of Monticello on the Monroe-Monticello highway, whose death after a critical illness from scarlet fever, occurred yesterday afternoon, were conducted this morning at the Cotherman home. The remains were interred in Highland cemetery here.

Carlyle had been critically ill for several days and only faint hope was entertained for his recovery. He failed to rally following the crisis. early yesterday and he passed away in the afternoon.

The youngster's father, Thomas Cotherman, is also ill with scarlet fever as is his older brother, Ernest, aged 9, and his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Cutherman, all of whom are improving, however. As a precaution against a possible spreading of she disease, the Simmons school, which Ernest attends, was closed Monday morning for at least a week.
