Mrs. Sam Crooks, 49, Dies; Services Held

Funeral services for Mrs. Sam H. Crooks, 49 years of age, Route 1, Monticello, who died at 9:32 p. m. Friday in the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, less than a half hour after being admitted, were held at 1:30 Tuesday afternoon in the Zwingli United Church of Christ here.

The Rev. Charles G. Workman, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were Roger Albert, Brodhead, Jacob Crooks, Monticello, Richard Leuzinger, Monroe, Freddie D. Zweifel, Belleville, Gilbert Zweifel, Jr., Albany, and Gerald Zweifel, Brooklyn.

Mrs. Crooks had been in failing health for several months and died on her birthday anniversary.

Alice Zweifel was born Feb. 4, 1923, in Exeter township, near Dayton, a daughter of Fred K. and Barbara Klassy Zweifel. She attended the Fergusson rural school, south of Dayton. On April 9, 1941, she was united in marriage to Sam H. Crooks in the Reformed church, Belleville. They farmed in Decatur township until 1960, when they moved to their present farm, located about a mile and a half west of Monticello.

Surviving are her husband; two sons, George and Edward, both of Route 2. Brodhead; five brothers, Fred, Gilbert and Walter Zweifel, all of Belleville, Alvin, Evansville, and Clarence, Brooklyn; a sisters, Mrs. Charles Winkelman, Milwaukee; and three granddaughters, Shannon, Joyce and Shelby Crooks.

She was preceded in death by Her father, March 6, 1946. her mother, June 19, 1953, and two brothers, Ivan and Herman.
