Mrs. Derendinger, 74, Dies Sunday After Short Illness

Funeral Services for Mrs. Charles Derendinger, 74 years of age, Exeter township, who passed away Sunday morning at 6:05 at the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, after a short illness, were held at 1:29 Wednesday afternoon in St. John's Evangelical and Reformed church, Monroe.

The Rev. Paul C. Kehle, church pastor, and the Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, pastor of the Monticello Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church, officiated. Burial was in Highland cemetery, Monticello. Sons and sons-in-law were pallbearers.

Mrs. Derendinger had been ill for only a short time.

Born in Fond du Lac county, Nov. 4, 1880, Anna Kelineschay was the daughter of Frederick and Mary Legler Kelineschay. She attended schools at Elmore, Wis. On Sept. 27, 1910, she was united in marriage, in Fond du Lac county, to Charles Derendinger. They always lived on farms in Green county following their marriage.

Mrs. Derendinger was a member of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church. A Gold Star mother, she was a member of the Amstutz-Marty Legion Auxiliary. She also was a member of the G.U.G.G. lodge, Monroe.

Surviving are the husband; three daughters, Mrs. Laurence Rosa, Evansville, Mrs. Ambrose Wenger, Blanchardville, and Mrs. Fred Ochsner Albany; three sons, Walter and Calvin, Monticello, and Robert, Belleville; four brothers, Ulrich, Phillips, Henry, Fond du Lac, John, Kewaskum, and Walter, Weyauwega; one sister, Mrs. Alvin Grether, Plymouth; 13 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by one son, Paul, with the U.S. army in Italy, Aug. 19, 1944; one grandson, Larry, 1945; and two brothers.
