

Robert C. Disrud

Robert C. Disrud, age 68, of Monticello, died at his home surrounded by his family on Tuesday, July 10, 2001 after a ten year battle with cancer.

Robert was born October 26, 1932 in Blanchard Township, Lafayette County, Wisconsin, the son of Milton and Emma (Anderson) Disrud. He graduated from Blanchardville High School in 1950. Bob served in the 663rd Field Artillery Battalion of the U.S. Army from 1955 until 1957 with 16 1/2 months spent in Korea and Okinawa. He married Sally Jane Wenger on June 10, 1962 at St. John's UCC, Monroe. Bob worked as a Technician with DHIA from 1957 until 1964. He then was self employed as an A-1 Technician until semi-retiring in 1997. Bob was a loyal and compassionate server of the Monticello area farming community.



Bob's love was music and he sang from the time he was a small boy. Bob along with Phil Skalet, Dave Jeglum, Ralph Grinder, and Henry Steinhauer formed the Perrmonts Quartet in 1972 and performed until disbanding in 1998. Robert was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello, where he served on the Consistory for several years. He also was a member of the Zwingli Choir, Green County United Singers, and Monticello American Legion Amstutz Marty Post #256.

Survivors include his wife Sally; a daughter, Judith (Don) Busser, Monticello; a son James R. Disrud and special friend, Dawn Ciaramita, both of Brodhead; three grandchildren: Nicole Disrud, Brandon Disrud, Ashley Busser; step-grandchildren, Jason and Jennifer Busser; and two sisters, Darlene Mellom, Arena; and Grace Disrud, Blanchardville.

He was preceded in death by his father in 1976, his mother in 1980, and a brother Malcolm in 1997.

Funeral services will be held Friday, July 13, 2001, at 11:00 am. at the Zwingli United Church of Christ with Rev. Lawrence Balleine and Rev.
