

Edmund Dooley Succumbs at 71

Sept. 22, 1886 - Jan. 2, 1958

A retired farmer and Monticello high school custodian, Edmund Dooley, 71, died at 5:25 p.m. yesterday (Jan. 2, 1958) at St. Clare hospital. He had been admitted New Year's Day for a heart condition. He was taken ill early that morning at his Monticello home.

Mr. Dooley was born Sept. 22, 1886, in Mt. Pleasant Township, the son of James and Theresa Rossiter Dooley. He and Elva Clark were married Oct. 17, 1906, in St. Rose Catholic Church at Brodhead. The Dooley's have always lived in the Brodhead and Monticello areas. They observed their golden wedding anniversary in 1956.

Surviving are the wife; two daughters, Mrs. Ralph Cairns, Fennimore, and Mrs. Fred Escher, Monticello; two sons, Bernard Dooley, Clarno, and Clark, Monticello; a brother, James F. Dooley, Monticello; four sisters, Miss Gertrude Dooley and Mrs. Mary Koepke, both of Madison; Mrs. Theresa Clapper and Mrs. Walter Evans, both of Janesville; 11 grandchildren and four-great-grandchildren.
