LONG ILLNESS ENDED

Mrs. Richard (Mary) Dooly, Jr., Passes Away After Several Months of Suffering.

January 8, 1882 - 1906

Mrs. Richard Dooly, Jr. answered the final summons at her home a few miles northeast of Monticello at 1 o'clock on Wednesday morning last after a lingering illness with pulmonary trouble. Her health had not been the best for the past three years, but not until about six months ago had her condition become such as to cause those near and dear to her any deep concern. Since that time, however, she had gradually failed in strength and it became apparent that it would only be a question of time when she would be called upon to depart forever from the scenes of earth. In spite of her long suffering, she bore up under her affliction with remarkable fortitude to the end, and her last days were made as comfortable for her as possible by the incessant care and constant devotion of loving relatives and friends.

Miss Mary Conley was born in the township of Exeter on January 8, 1882, where she lived until three years of age, when she removed with her parents to Brodhead. She returned here about six years ago to take her home with her aunt, Mrs. Catharine Corcoran, and since that time has continually resided in this vicinity. She was married to Richard Dooly, Jr, on Nov. 26, 1902. This union was blessed with one child, a little daughter, who died and was laid to rest last November. Besides the bereaved husband, she is survived by her parents, Mr. and Mrs, P. Conley; of Janesville, three sisters and two brothers, all of whom have the sincere sympathy of many friends in the sorrow that has come to them.

Mrs. Dooly was of a kind and loving disposition and had scores of friends, which was plainly evident by the large concourse which followed her remains to their last resting place.
