YOUNG LIFE ENDED. Mrs. John Dooly Expires After Long illness-Funeral Today.

July 3, 1888 - 1906

Mrs, John Dooly, who for several weeks has been in a critical condition at the home of her father, A. S. Lewis, passed peacefully away at an early hour Sunday morning. Her illness, which had such a sad termination, dates back about three months ago when she gave birth to a little son. At one time it was thought that she was in a fair way to recovery, but the improvement did not continue and later, when evidence of pulmonary trouble became apparent, all hopes of her ultimate recovery were given up, and the time when she would be called upon to yield to the inevitable was considered only a matter of a few weeks,

Tessie Maude Lewis was born in the township of Exeter on July 3, 1888, where her entire life was spent, with the exception of the time the family has resided in this village. Her mother preceded her in death several years ago and ten years ago her only sister died. She. was married to John Dooly on July 4th, 1905, who, together with the infant son, survives her.

Mrs. Dooly was of a bright and sunny disposition, highly esteemed by a large circle of friends, and her untimely death is deeply deplored by all. The sincere sympathy of the entire community goes out to the bereaved husband, as well at the other relatives of the deceased, in the great and crushing sorrow that has come to them.

The funeral was held from the house today at 12 o'clock, and from the M, E. church at 1 o'clock, Rev. Wm. Hints officiating. A large concourse of sympathizing neighbors and friends were in attendance and many beautiful floral offerings were in evidence, a silent testimony to the high esteem in which the departed on had always been held.

The remains were taken to the Exeter cemetery for interment in the family lot.
