

Mrs. Emil Escher Dies at Monticello

MONTICELLO (Times Special) —Mrs. Emil Escher, 69, died at 7:20 p. m. yesterday in her home here of a heart condition. She had been ailing two years.

The former Emily Sauter, she was born in St. Pilt, France, March 20, 1883, the daughter of Anton and Veronica Huesler Sauter. She came to America in 1909 and on May 5 of the same year was married to Emil Escher in Monroe. They have always lived in the vicinity of Monroe and Monticello, moving to Monticello in 1932 where he was cheesemaker at the Northside Swiss Cheese Co-op.

Mrs. Escher enjoyed gardening, flowers and fishing.

She leaves her husband; two sons, Fred and Arthur, Monticello; one daughter, Mrs. Harry Klassesy, Monticello; one sister in France and eight grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents, two sisters and one brother.

Mrs. Escher was a member of St. Victor's Church in Monroe.
