

## **Emma Gould**

**Feb. 25, 1882 – Oct. 23, 1958**

### **Mrs. Clarence Gould Dies Thursday; Rites Held Here Saturday**

Funeral services for Mrs. Clarence Gould, 76 years of age, who died at 12:45 a.m. last Thursday at her home here, after a long illness, were held at 2 Saturday afternoon at the Evangelical United Brethren church here.

The Rev. B. L. Holling officiated and burial was in the Exeter cemetery. Pallbearers were Adam Duerst, Willard D. Prisk, Emory Silver, Raymond Talmage, H. A. Walters and Dr. R. A. Woodruff.

Mrs. Gould had been virtually bedridden since suffering a stroke in 1949.

Emma Edwards was born in Exeter township, Feb. 25, 1882, the daughter of Frank and Eliza Jordan Edwards. She attended the Exeter rural school. On Feb. 25, 1902, she was united in marriage to Clarence Gould, the ceremony taking place in Freeport. They farmed in Exeter township for many years on the farm now operated by their son, Howard. They retired in 1947, moving to Monticello.

Mrs. Gould was a member of Attica Ladies' Aid society and a former member of the Attica Methodist church. She attended the Evangelical United Brethren church since coming to Monticello.

She is survived by her husband; the son, Howard; one daughter, Mrs. Forrest Taylor, Monticello; 12 grandchildren, and 12 great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by two brothers, Bert, in 1932, and Charles, in infancy, and two sisters, Mrs. Mae Gift, 1942, and Clara at age 14.
