Willis Haddinger is Called After Long Illness; Rites Held Former Mt. Pleasant Man Expires Saturday in Monroe Hospital

Funeral services for Willis Haddinger, 35 years of age, former Mt. Pleasant township resident and well known in Monticello, who passed away at 7:45 Saturday evening in the St. Clare hospital, Monroe, where he had been a patient for many months, were held at 2 Tuesday afternoon in the Shriner-Neushwander funeral home, Monroe.

Progressive paralysis, which had its inception in December, 1946, was responsible for his demise.

The Rev. Paul C. Kehle, pastor of St. John's Evangelical and Reformed church, Monroe, officiated, and burial was in Greenwood cemetery, Monroe. Pallbearers were Werner Haessig, Belleville, Walter Fahrney and William Schultz, Albany, Ray T. Silver and Elmer Schwerin, Monticello, and Erwin, Spring, Monroe.

He was the son of William J. and Lydia Lehnerr Haddinger, who reside in Monroe. He was born Aug. 8, 1912, in Clarno township. The Haddinger family moved to Mt. Pleasant township in 1916, purchasing the large farm which is now owned by Jacob Trumpy, about four miles east of Monticello. Mr. Haddinger moved in 1945 to a farm near Belleville which he had purchased. He resided there until becoming ill a year later.

Surviving are his parents; one sister, Miss Alice, Milwaukee; four brothers, Fred, Ft, Atkinson, Walter and Harry, Monticello, and Ray, Albany. A brother, Herman, passed away in 1936.
