

Kenneth Halverson

WAUPACA — Kenneth D. Halverson, 73, of Waupaca, died Sunday, Jan. 18, 1998 at his home.

He was born May 9, 1924 in Wiota, the son of Selmer and Matilda (Fjeldvang) Halverson.

Mr. Halverson, a World War II veteran, graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1951 with a master's degree in agronomy.

He married Dorothy Stauffacher Sept. 12, 1952 in Monticello.

Mr. Halverson's first job as a research assistant with the UW Plant Pathology Department at the Peninsular Branch Experiment Station in Sturgeon Bay. Four years later he became a farmer and home agent with the University of Wisconsin Extension in Green County. He transferred to the US. Soil Conservation Service where he worked until retiring in 1985 after 27 years of service, 19 of which were spent in Waupaca County as district conservationist.

Survivors include his wife, Dorothy; two daughters, Mrs. Jay (Heidi) Halverson-Gordon, Manhattan Beach, Calif., and Connie (Jim Kostrzewa) Halverson, Iola; a son, Eric (Angie) Halverson, Waupaca; four grandchildren; and two brothers, Dale (Arla) Halverson, Indian Head Park, Ill., and Norman (Marian) Halverson, Pleasant Hill, Calif.

He was preceded in death by a brother, Alvie.

Memorial services are 11 am. Wednesday at First United Methodist Church in Waupaca. The Rev. James Rowlette assisted by the Rev. Gerald Moede will officiate. Following cremation, Mr. Halverson's cremains will be buried in Highland Cemetery, Monticello.
