Katherine Hoesly, Local Citizen, Dies After Long Illness Rev. A. Muehlmeier Will Conduct Last Rites Today

Funeral services for Mrs. Katherine Hoesly, 78 years of age, well known resident of Monticello and vicinity for many years, who passed away Monday afternoon at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Elizabeth Rolph, Monticello, following an illness with heart trouble and pneumonia which had its inception early in November, will be held at 1:30 this (Thursday) afternoon in the home and at 2 in the Reformed church.

Rev. A. Muehlmeier, pastor of the Reformed church, will officiate. Interment will be in Highland cemetery.

Native of Switzerland

Mrs. Hoesly was a native of Switzerland, having been born Dec. 11, 1858, Canton Glarus, the daughter of Fridolin and Sarah Kundert Voegeli. She immigrated to America in 1866, making the trip across in the company of her parents. The family first settled in Jordan township. On June 7, 1877, she was united in marriage to Marcus B. Hoesly, the ceremony taking place in New Glarus. They resided on a farm in Exeter township until 1908, when they moved to this village to reside. Mr. Hoesly passed away in 1913.

Survivors are one son, Baltz Hoesly, Exeter township; two daughters, Mrs. Elizabeth Rolph, Monticello, and Mrs. Sarah Elmer, New Glarus; one brother, Matt Voegeli, Monticello; three grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

Mrs. Hoesly was a woman of many commendable qualities and word of her passing will be sad news to her many friends both here and elsewhere. She was not only a devoted wife and mother but an ideal neighbor.

She was a member of the Reformed church.
