Rudolph Hoesly Is Called; To Conduct Final Rites Today
Aged Resident of Village Is Summoned After Stroke

Rudolph Hoesly, 87 years of age, well known resident of Monticello for the past 40 years, passed away at his home at 3:30 Tuesday morning following a stroke suffered Saturday. Mr. Hoesly had been failing during most of the winter, brought about by his advanced years.

Born in New Glarus Twp.

Rudolph Hoesly was born Sept. 14, 1850, in New Glarus township, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Hoesly. On Nov. 12, 1874, he was married to Barbara Stauffacher, the ceremony taking place in Monticello. For many years the couple followed the occupation of farming and lived on the Hoesly homestead farm near New Glarus. They moved to Monticello about 40 years ago and resided on Highland street. Mrs. Hoesly passed away Jan. 25, 1933.

The sudden passing of Mr Hoesly has brought sincere regret to a great number of friends throughout this section of the county, Mr. Hoesly having numbered many friends among his acquaintances during his long years. He took great interest in horses and until a few years ago did much traveling with horse and buggy. He made at least one trip each year to Oshkosh with his horse and buggy, taking several days to make the journey.

Survivors are three sons, Wilbert S. Hoesly, Monticello, Anton Hoesly, Weston, Wis., and Edward Hoesly, Janesville; one adopted daughter, Mrs. Margaret Hefty, New Glarus, 12 grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by one daughter, Mrs. Alma Freitag, Oshkosh, who passed away Aug. 26, 1932, in Oshkosh.

Services at 2:30 Today Funeral services will be held this (Thursday) afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Voegeli funeral home, Rev. W. G. Schulz, pastor of the Monticello Evangelical church, will officiate. Interment will be in Highland cemetery.
