Ernest Holcomb Dies in Monroe

Monroe—Ernest Holcomb, 30, a rural school teacher in the vicinity of Monroe for six years, died at 10 p. m. Monday at the Deaconess hospital, where he had been a patient since Friday. He had been ill for two months with heart trouble.

The son of Ernest and Rose Blumer Holcomb, he was born in Adams township Dec. 4, 1904, graduated from the Monroe high school in 1925 and the Green county normal in 1927. He taught two years in the Memorial school, Blanchardville, and four years in the Buckskin school, Washington. He had been engaged to teach in the West Clarno school this year.

Mr. Holcomb married Miss Florence Henneman July 18, 1931, in Chippewa Falls. He has always lived in the vicinity of Monroe.

Surviving relatives are: His widow; a son, Gordon, 3; his mother; nine brothers, Robert, Clarence, James and Arthur, Washington township, Fred, Mt. Pleasant township, Harold, Adams township, Ora, Monticello, Marvin, Monroe, and Leon, Argyle; and one sister, Mrs. Fred Zweifel, Washington township. His father preceded him in death Jan. 19, 1930.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p. m. Thursday in a funeral home at 1018 Seventh avenue, Monroe, the Rev. Mr. Hehn, pastor of the Clarno Evangelical church, officiating. Burial will be in Greenwood cemetery, Monroe.
