Harold E. Holcomb, 86, 2310 16th Ave., a lifelong resident of Green County, died unexpectedly shortly after midnight this morning, October 6, in St. Clare Hospital. He had entered the hospital Monday. Death resulted from complications following surgery performed Wednesday. He had been in failing health since February.
