

Luverne I. Holcomb, 49, Stricken Friday;

Rites Held Tuesday

Funeral services for Luverne Ira Holcomb, 49, native of Adams township, and a one-time Monticello business man, who passed away at 10:30 am. Friday, Oct. 7, 1966, in St. Mary's hospital, Madison, as a result of complications which developed following surgery, were held at 3 pm. Tuesday in Grace Lutheran church, Monroe.

The Rev. James C. Plymire officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery, Monticello.

Mr. Holcomb, who had been a Madison resident for some time, had been in failing health for several months.

He was born in Adams township Aug. 2, 1917, the son of Ira and Hulda Marty Holcomb. He attended the Dividing Ridge rural school. On Dec. 19, 1940, he was united in marriage to Mildred Hovde. They resided in Monticello for some time, during which Mr. Holcomb operated a trucking business here. In recent years he had followed the carpenter trade.

He was a member of Grace Lutheran church, Monroe.
