Erwin Kissling, Monticello, Dies

Erwin Kissling Sr., 62, Monticello tavern operator and former bakery owner, died at 3:15 p. m. Saturday in St. Clare hospital where he had been admitted less than 12 hours before. He suffered a heart condition since September but death was due to a cerebral hemorrhage.

Mr. Kissling was born Jan. 4, 1898, in Olten, Switzerland, the son of Robert and Julia Kissling. He came to Monroe in 1920, the year that he and Lydia Geisel were married in New York City. The Kisslings operated a bakery in Monticello from 1925 to 1939 and since then had owned the Kissling tavern on Main street, Monticello.

He was a member of Monticello Union Masonic lodge.

Surviving are the wife; a son, Erwin Jr., football coach at Oregon high school; a daughter, Mrs. Bernard Knoblauch, Milwaukee, a sister, Mrs. William) Kaiser, Muttenz, Switzerland, and four grandchildren.

Services will be at 1:30 p. m. tomorrow in Zwingli United Church of Christ. Rev. J. Allan Mittler, pastor, will officiate. Burial will be in Highland cemetery with Masonic rites.
