## Death Of Abe Kubly Ends 50-Year Span In Green County Came Here With Wife From Berne Nearly Half Century Ago

Abraham Kubly, Sr. aged 71, a resident of Green county since 1885 and for many years a respected citizen of this village and vicinity, passed away at his home here at 12:30 Friday afternoon, following a brief illness with heart trouble. Mr. Kubly had been afflicted with a rather severe cold for a few days prior to his fatal illness. Two days before the end he suffered a heart attack, from which he failed to rally. His death came as a shock to relatives and friends alike, as many were unaware that the condition of his health was other than normal. Mr. Kubly was a native of Canton Berne, Switzerland, where he was born Nov. 10, 1862. He was one of the children of Abraham and Sylvia Schindler Kubly. His marriage to Marie Babler occurred at Matt, Canton of Glarus, 1883. The couple came from their native land to Wisconsin in the spring of 1885 and settled on a farm in Jordan township, Green county. Later they moved to a farm in Mt. Pleasant township, 3 miles east of Monticello, where they continued to live until they moved to the village several years ago.

Surviving are the widow and seven children, as follows: Abraham Kubly, Jr., Mrs. Matt H. Wittenwyler, Mrs. Walter Wittenwyler, Monticello; Mrs. Marion. Swan, Attica; Henry Kubly, Monroe; John Kubly, Brodhead, and Dan Kubly, Chicago. He also leaves a sister, Mrs. Conrad Trumpy, California, a brother, Henry Kubly, Mt. Pleasant, 14 grandchildren and 6 great-grandchildren. A daughter, Mrs. Henry Dooly, and a son, Conrad, preceded him in death.

Funeral services were conducted Sunday afternoon in the home at. 12:30 and at 2:00 in the Reformed church, of which he was a member. Rev. A. Muehlmeier, pastor of the church, conducted the service and burial was in Highland cemetery.
