Elaine M. Kundert, age 90 of Monroe, passed away on November 11, 2010 at Pleasant View Nursing Home. She was born May 28, 1920 in Lafayette County, the daughter of Elmer and Marie (Hanson) Erickson. She graduated from Monticello High School and Green County Teacher's College and taught rural school in Green County and Winnebago County in Illinois.
