Conduct Last Rites For Nicholas Legler
Summoned After Illness of Several Weeks' Duration

Funeral services for Nicholas Legler, 67 years of age, well known Monticello resident for the past several years, who passed away in his home here at 10 o'clock Thursday morning following an illness of several weeks' duration, were conducted at the Voegeli funeral home at 2 Saturday afternoon, Rev. A. Muehlmeier, pastor of the Monticello Reformed church, conducting the services. Interment was in Highland cemetery.

Mr. Legler had been ill for several weeks prior to his sudden death. Several days before his death Mr. Legler became seriously ill and he failed to recover his strength. Death was due to heart failure. Mr. Legler's many friends were unaware of the sever nature of his illness and his death came as a sudden blow.

Nicholas Legler was born in New Glarus township, the son of George and Barbara Schindler Legler. His boyhood days were spent on the farm where he was born and in later life he followed the occupation of farming. For the past several years he had operated a small truck garden at the edge of the village. Mr. Legler never married.

Surviving are four brothers, Andrew and David, Mt. Pleasant township, John, New Glarus, and Abraham, Belleville; one sister, Mrs. John C. Blum, Monticello, and several nieces and nephews. One sister, Mrs. J. C. Steinman, Sr, highly esteemed Monticello resident, passed away March 31.
