

## **YOUNG LIFE ENDED.**

**Mrs. John Lengacher Passes away at Her Home in Monroe.**

**April 12, 1881 - 1906**

Mrs. John Lengacher died at her home in Monroe at 12 o'clock Saturday night, after an extended illness. She had been in poor health for about two years and but recently returned from Milwaukee, where she had been receiving medical treatment for lung trouble. Since her return she had declined steadily and although everything possible was done to stay the progress of the disease it availed nothing, and the end was not unexpected.

The deceased was formerly a resident of this vicinity, where she has always been held in high esteem by a large circle of friends and to whom the sorrowful news of her untimely demise occasioned sincere regret. Her maiden name was Julia Kundert and she was born in Milwaukee, April 12, 1881. She was married to Mr. Lengacher on the 3rd of November, 1899, and, besides her husband, she is survived by a little son; her mother, Mrs. James E. Pierce; two brothers and one sister also survive her.

The remains were brought here from Monroe yesterday on the noon train, by way of Brodhead, and funeral services were held at the German Reformed church, conducted by the Rev. Carl Heyl. Interment was in the local cemetery. The large concourse of relatives and friends who turned out to pay their last tribute of respect to the departed fully evidenced the high esteem in which she has always been held,
