**1920 – March 1934**

### **Mt. Pleasant Lady, 34 Years Old, Dies After Long Illness Death Claims Mrs. Rudy Leuenberger in Capital City Hospital**

After a lingering illness which extended over a period of several months, Mrs. Rudolph Leuenberger, 34 years of age, a resident of Mount Pleasant township, about two miles northeast of Monticello, passed away at 6 o'clock Thursday morning in the Madison General hospital.

Mrs. Leuenberger had been a patient in the hospital for two weeks, but the unusual nature of her illness was beyond successful treatment. Her condition had recently grown worse and it was known for some time that the ultimate recovery from her ailment was impossible.

A native of Switzerland, Bertha Volkhart came to the United States about nine years ago. On May 21, 1927, she was united in marriage to Rudolph Leuenberger in Monroe and the couple had since made their home on the Leuenberger farm about two miles northeast of this village.

Besides the husband, Mrs. Leuenberger is survived by two children, Violet, aged 6, and Lillian, 2, at home; her parents and one brother and a sister residing in Switzerland, and another sister, Mrs. Albert Vogel, who resides in Monroe township.

Pall bearers were Henry Kubly, Casper Zentner, Edwin Buehl, Walter Zeller, Fred Koser and O. E. Zentner.

Funeral services were conducted at 1:30 o'clock Friday afternoon in the home and at 2 in the Reformed church here. Rev. A. Muehlmeier, pastor of the church, officiated and interment was in Greenwood cemetery, Monroe.
