Emil M. Leutenegger, 71, Albany, died Wednesday, October 13, 1993, at Pleasant View Nursing Home, Monroe.

He was born July 12, 1922 in the Canton of St. Gallen, Switzerland, the son of Emil M. and Marie E. (Specker) Leutenegger Sr. He married Sarah Brummett October 5, 1945 in Indiana.

He came to the United States January 6, 1926 and his family settled in the Green County area. He worked in Green County as a carpenter for general building contractors for many years.

A veteran, he served in World War II in the U.S. Army. He entered service Oct. 5, 1940 at Madison and served as a Tech. 5 with the 1560th Service Unit. He served overseas for one year and four months in the Camp French, Morocco and Tunisia campaigns. He received the E.A.M.E. Ribbon with two stars and the American Defense Ribbon. He was discharged Oct. 2, 1945 at Wakeman Hospital Center, Camp Atterbury, Indiana.

He was a member of the American Legion Post of Albany.
