

John Lynn, 73, Yields to Death

Dies at Home of Son Here at 8 O'Clock Saturday Morning; Throat Infection Cause

Final rites for John Lynn, 73 years of age, who passed away at 8 o'clock Saturday morning in the home of his son, M. E. Lynn, following a lingering illness from infection of the throat, were conducted at 1:30 Monday afternoon in the Lynn home.

The services were in charge of Rev. A. Muehlmeier, pastor of the Reformed church. Interment was in Highland cemetery.

Mr. Lynn had been in poor health for some time, but within the past several weeks, his condition took a decided turn for the worse and little hope was entertained for his ultimate recovery. He had been seriously ill for some time before his death.

A native of Exeter township, Mr. Lynn was born Jan. 1, 1857, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Lynn, who were numbered among the early settlers of that community. On October 28, 1885, he was united in marriage to Mary Edgar, who preceded him in death several years ago. For a number of years, Mr. Lynn was engaged in school teaching. For the past few years, however, he was employed as janitor at the Monticello public schools.

Known for his keen wit and joviality, Mr. Lynn had many friends and acquaintances. His never failing humor was an incessant source of amusement and he will be deeply missed by local students and pupils with whom he was very popular.

Survivors are two sons, M. E., Monticello, and Robert W., Santa Barbara, Cal., and two brothers, Alonzo, Monroe, and Henry, Scranton, Iowa.
