Anna Marty January 28, 1859 – October 1933

Mrs. Charles Marty, Life Long Resident Of County, Dies Succumbs to Death After Lingering Illness at Home in Village

Mrs. Charles Marty, Sr. aged 74, life-long resident of this section of Green county, passed away at her home on Monroe street shortly after 6 o'clock Saturday evening, following an illness of several months' duration. Mrs. Marty's health had not been the best for a number of years, and complications which developed in the past year ultimately resulted in her death.

Anna Legler was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Adam Legler and was born in the New Glarus vicinity on January 28, 1859. On Dec. 7, 1876, she was united in marriage there to Charles Marty, the ceremony being performed by Rev. J. T. Etter. Following their marriage they lived on a farm in Washington township until 26 years ago last spring, when they retired and moved to Monticello. Mr. Marty preceded her in death on Nov. 20 of last year.

The passing of this worthy woman from our midst removes one who was always held in high esteem by a large circle of acquaintances. She was not only a kind and accommodating neighbor and a true friend, but possessed many other qualities which endeared her to all with whom she came in contact. She was a member of the Washington township Reformed church and also of the Ladies' Aid society of that congregation.

She is survived by three children, Charles R., who lives on the old homestead farm; Mrs. John Moritz, of this village, and Henry R. Marty, of Roberts, Wis. She also leaves a sister and two brothers, Lena Adams and Adam and Fred Legler, Hastings, Neb.; seven grandchildren. Funeral services were held at 1:30 Tuesday afternoon in the home and at 2 in the Washington township Reformed church, with Rev. A. Muehlmeier officiating.
